

APPENDIX

DAIRY PROGRAM PROVINCIAL ADMINISTRATION

BRITISH COLUMBIA—GRADUATED ENTRY PROGRAM

An industrial milk producer qualifies for graduated entry into the fluid milk market if he has:

- 1) been in production for one year,
- 2) been producing Grade "A" milk,
- 3) a bulk tank,
- 4) made application in January (of every year),

then fluid quota allocated will be:

- 5) equal to 100% of average daily production during the quota building period.

the fluid milk price in February 1976 was \$13.57 per hundredweight and;

the industrial milk price ranged from \$8.10 to \$8.90 per hundredweight.

ALBERTA—GRADUATED ENTRY PROGRAM

An industrial milk producer qualifies for graduated entry into the fluid milk market if he has:

- 1) been in production 12 months preceeding September 1 of year of application during which dairy production averaged 500 pounds per day,
- 2) been producing Grade "A" milk,
- 3) a bulk tank,
- 4) made application by September 1 (of every year),

then fluid quota allocated will be:

- 5) equal daily production during quota building period up to 800 pounds.
- 6) Presently fluid quotas are set at 115% of preceeding years fluid sales. If required to accommodate graduated entrants, fluid quotas will be raised to:
 - 120% of 1974 sales on January 1/75;
 - 125% of 1975 sales on January 1/76;
 - 130% of 1976 sales on January 1/77.

In addition, fluid quotas created from production cuts and sales increase over and above the amount earned by existing quota holders will be made available to graduated entrants.

the fluid milk price in February 1976 was \$12.21 per hundredweight and;

the industrial milk price was \$8.00 per hundredweight.

SASKATCHEWAN—GRADUATED ENTRY PROGRAM

An industrial milk producer qualifies for graduated entry into the fluid milk market if he has:

- 1) been in production one year prior to application,
- 2) been producing Grade "A" milk,
- 3) a bulk tank,
- 4) made application on or before July 1 of every year,

then fluid quota allocated will be:

- 5) equal to 100% of daily production during 5 lowest months of production during qualifying period, up to a maximum of 1,000 pounds per day.

- 6) Limit on entry into the fluid market to the extent that total fluid quota for province shall not exceed 120% of fluid sales in year 1; 125% of fluid sales in year 2; 130% of fluid sales in year 3. Also, fluid quota shall not exceed 140% of fluid sales in any milk shed.

the fluid milk price in February 1976 was \$11.07 per hundredweight and;

the industrial milk price was \$8.56 per hundredweight.

MANITOBA—GRADUATED ENTRY PROGRAM

An industrial milk producer qualifies for graduated entry into the fluid milk market if he has:

- 1) been producing Grade "A" milk,
- 2) a bulk tank,
- 3) made application.

Since the quota system in Manitoba has been suspended, the percentage of total sales at fluid milk prices each month determines the percentage of producers' shipments to be paid at fluid milk prices.

the fluid milk price in February 1976 was \$12.20 per hundredweight and;

the industrial milk prices ranged from \$8.21 to \$9.06 per hundredweight.

ONTARIO—GRADUATED ENTRY PROGRAM

An industrial milk producer qualifies for graduated entry into the fluid milk market if he has:

PROGRAM A

- 1) been producing milk or cream since July 1, 1968,
 - 2) farm premises and milk meeting provincial standards,
 - 3) a bulk tank,
 - 4) made application prior to May 15 of every year,
- then fluid quota allocated will be:
- the greater of:
- a) 89% of 9 months of 1965/66 excluding peak period;
 - b) 1973/74 production maximum of 400 pounds per day;
 - c) 1973/74 production if below 400 pounds per day;
 - d) the free quota allotment is allocated over five years.

PROGRAM B

- 1) marketed milk or cream in Ontario for at least the two consecutive and complete dairy years prior to date of entry; marketed at least 400 pounds per day in the 12 months ending March 31,
 - 2) farm premises and milk meeting provincial standards,
 - 3) a bulk tank,
 - 4) application made prior to May 15 of every year,
- then fluid quota allocated will be:
- 5) 400 pounds per day over five years.
- the fluid milk prices in February 1976 was \$12.01 per hundredweight and,
- the industrial milk prices ranged from \$8.21 to \$8.85 per hundredweight.
