In the month of March, the Rev. C. B. Washer was appointed to the mission of Brompton and Windsor; and the Rev. Peter Roe to the mission of Inverness.

In the month of October, the Rev. E. A. W. King was appointed to the mission of Rivière du Loup; the Revd. James Hepburn to the mission of Magog and Georgeville; and the Rev. T. Blaylock, to the mission of New Carlisle.

In the month of November, the Rev. R. Harvey was appointed to the mission of Shigawake.

The missions unprovided with the ministrations of the Church at the present time are Labrador, Bury, and Malbaie.

By the appointment of the Rev. F. A. Smith, who carries with him his allowance from the Clergy Trust Fund, to the mission of New Liverpool, that mission has ceased to depend for aid upon the Diocesan Board.

The reports of the elergy are hereunto appended, from which we learn how great is the financial depression almost universally prevalent in the missions aided by the Board
