DENIED HIS MEN BROKE TRAINING

MADE INROADS ON LIBERAL MAJORITY

Election in Linlithgowshire, Scotland, Proved to Be Unexpectedly Close.

LINLITHGOW, Scotland, Nov. 8.—(Can. Press.)—Mr. Pratt, Liberal candidate for Linlithgowshire, was successful over his Unionist opponent, James Kidd, but by a greatly reduced majority. The figures were: Mr. Pratt, Liberal, 5915; James Kidd, Unionist, 5294. Majority 521.

At the last election Alexander Ure, the Liberal, polled 5385 votes against 3745 received by James Kidd, the Unionist. Mr. Ure vacated the seat a few weeks ago on his appointment as president of the Scottish court of sessions, and it was difficult for the Liberals to find a candidate to replace him. Mr. Pratt, who was a former bailie of Glasgow and practically unknown in the constituency, was selected to meet the Unionist James Kidd, who had been voted the elector for years.

COMRADE STONE OF HOUSING BILLS WAS A BY HOW W. J. HANNA

Bain Ave. Development When Completed Will Represent an Investment of Half a Million—Prominent Citizens of Toronto and Hamilton at the Ceremony.

On Bain avenue, east of Broadview on Saturday Hon. W. J. Hanna, Minister of the Housing Commission, presided at the second building development. His Honor, Sir John Gibson, presided.
