that she may be free from the same, and may be enabled to contract matrimony with any other person with whom it would be lawful for her to contract matrimony if they the said Catherine Morrison and John F. Morrison had not intermarried. and that she may have the custody of said child; and whereas it is expedient that the prayer of the said petition should be granted: Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

Her marriage

1. The said marriage between the said Catherine Morrison 10 and the said John F. Morrison, her husband, is hereby dissolved, and shall be henceforth null and void to all intents and purposes whatsoever.

She may marry again 2. The said Catherine Morrison may, at any time hereafter, marry any other man whom she might lawfully marry 15 in case the said marriage had not been solemnized.

Rights of her subsequent issue.

• In case of the said Catherine Morrison again contracting matrimony with any person with whom it would have been lawful for her to contract matrimony if they the said Catherine Morrison and the said John F. Morrison had not 20 intermatried and having any issue born of her to such person, the said issue shall be, to all intents and purposes, legitimate, and the rights of them the said issue and each of them and of their respective heirs, as respects their and each of their capacity to inherit, have, hold, enjoy and transmit 25 all and any manner of property, real and personal, of what nature or kind soever, from any person or persons whomsoever shall be and remain the same as they would have been to all intents and purposes whatsoever, if the said marriage between the said Catherine Morrison and John F. Morrison 30 had not taken place.
