The Natives of this Kingdom, are very frugal, yet live in much plenty, the Earth producing every where abundance: Nor did their Navigation in forner days, less conduce to their Support and Grandeur; being held the first Europeans that publickly prafficked into the remote parts of the World, to ring it to any confiderable Perfection. The Peoble are generally straight Limbed, and well proporfloned, very fost skinned, but somewhat inclined to swarthiness, by reason of the heat in those parts; the Air is very healthy, and the Country for the most part Hilly, though few of note.

The Roman Catholick Religion, is only publicky professed. There are three Arch-Bishopricks, viz. at Lisbon, Braga, and Elvora; and Ten Bishopricks. They have Parliaments as occasion requires it, held at Lisbon and Porto, and Twenty seven places have their Generalities; and the Revenues of the Kingdom is held to be about Ten Millions of Livers, not accounting their Collonies in the East-Indies: And although Portugal was seized on by the King of Spain, after the fatal Battle of Alcazar in Affrick, and the Death of King Henry, who Succeeded Sabastian, slain by the Moors; it revolted in the year, 1640. And is governed by a King of its own, as a separate Kingdom from Spain, and thus much for Portugal,
