A fall in the proportion of the Bank of England's reserve to liability from 47.44 per cent. last week to 41.23 to-day was the main item of financial importance to the stock markets to-day. This weak statement, while not considered optimism, had no immediately bad effect on quotations. On the theory that both ill and good news are discounted ahead it was natural to witness a recovery both at New York, and locally in the prices of securities. The Toronto market remained quiet, despite the better support to values. The main points of interest locally were Mackay and Queen City. The latter was in much better enquiry than in several months, the lower level of prices attracting a following that could not be procured when the stock was selling ten to twelve points higher. Subscriptions to the rights expire to-morrow, and with these out of the way a market will have to be made for the new stock. It was asserted to-day that the next advance would be for this purpose, and that an increase in dividend might be used to provide what the ordinary fluctuations failed to accomplish. Considerable hesitation and finessing is going on at New York that cannot be construed into a permanent improvement in stock values. The money market is and will continue to be the dictating factor in shaping prices, and there is absolutely no prospect that any abundance of funds can be available for some time to come.

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
