Two years and three months ago, long before the eight-hour law was ever heard of, it was perfectly well known to the mining world of British Columbia that the ore in the mines was being rapidly exhausted, and that if the same course was maintained the mine must be driven into liquidation.

"The actual condition of affairs confronting the company is as follows:

"The company owes to shareholders, mortgageholders and sundry creditors £342,875 bs 6d. less a small balance to profit and loss account. It possesses against this, the mine, a copper stack, a lead stack, and certuin realizable assets about equivalent to its floating debt, and £200 in cash. This latter item has probably been expended since the report was issued. The mine's value as an asset is purely problematical, depending upon the expenditure of capital in development. The copper stack depends entirely for its value except as old iron upon the mine. As has already been pointed out in The Review, the Hall mines smelter is not in a position to get any great supplies of copper ore from outside sources. The lead stack, with careful management, might pay, but in order to meet the competition of other smelters it would have to
