A king is a patient who dominates his doctor, up to the time when a doctor must become a king to dominate him and everyone about him.

It is not easy to do justice to kings. "Nothing to do and plenty to eat," was Artemus Ward's estimate of a king. That estimate tallied with the general impression. But it may be doubted if there was a man in England who worked harder than the King. His may not have been the kind of labor.
