BEFORE THE LEGISLATURE.

"Cap" Sullivan's Timber Deal Will Be Inquired Into.

Capt. John Sullivan's timber concession in the Rutherford township will form the subject of a spirited debate in the legislature to-day, so it is promised. It will come up when Mr. Whitney will interrogate the Ministry on the point, but as the answer of the Minister must be accepted without comment, Mr. Whitney will force a discussion by moving later on for a return of the correspondence in the matter.

The facts came out during the Gagey inquiry. It was shown that one Shannon had applied for and was granted the timber concession, saying \$250 for it, but not wishing to take up the concession Capt. Sullivan, it was stated, took the timber concession. The concession then passed into the hands of Mr. Charlton for a mere consideration of \$3000. The Conservatives will strive to enlighten the House on the transaction, and an interesting session may result.

Hornbrook, Joseph Oliver and John Donoghue, P.G.M.'s. The local marshal, assisted by Past Grand Masters Dr. Bowie, J. A. Humphrey and Dr. Smuck.
