Washington, D.C., Dec. 14.-(Special.) -"Canadians have forgotten all bitterness they felt over the Alaskan boundary award," said Owen L. Evans of Montreal. "Just now they are intensely interested in Chamberlain's propaganda for a preferential tariff. Ninety per cent, of the Canadian peo-

Ninety per cent. of the Canadian people are in sympathy with Mr. Chamberlain, and it is their confident belief he will be victorious in his campaign. "The hope of preferential taris trade with England has about wiped out any desire in Canada for reciprocity with the United States, and I doubt very much whether the United States government could succeed now in negotiating a reciprocity treaty. I understand there has been a revival of talk in the United States of annexing Canada. I would like to go on record as saying that day will never come, at least not in our lifetime, when Canada will be part of United States."
