FARMERS BADLY SCARED BY POWER RING AGENTS

Many Consulting Lawyers About Hydro Right of Way—Offer For Grimsby Park

HAMILTON, Aug. 6.—(Special)—Emissaries of the power ring are busy trying to obstruct the agents of the hydro-electric power commission, who are obtaining a right of way for the government's power line, and they have worked the farmers into a terrible state of excitement. They have got the farmers to believe that the commission pays for only a narrow right of way, and insists upon cutting down all trees, including fruit trees, for a width of 130 feet. The fact of the matter is that only big trees likely to fall across the power line will be taken out, and only for a width of 66 feet, and the farmers are being paid handsomely. So badly have the farmers been frightened that some of them have been consulting lawyers, who have applied to the attorney-general for a fiat. This has been refused so far.

The police have about given up hope of capturing Mark Tompkins' pal. Offer For Grimsby Park. The Beachland Realty Company, Cleveland, has made an offer to the liquidators of the Grimsby Park, and the Cottage Owners' Association has approved of the offer, and will co-operate with the company, which promises to make many improvements. The general policy will be in the hands of the cottage-owners, who will be allowed free access to the park. Twenty-five bicycles have been stolen during the past two weeks by a gang of thieves. The parks board is taking steps to acquire a large park at Station 8 on the Beach.

Bigamy Charge Dropped. The charge of bigamy against John Patterson, alias John Kavanagh, has been dropped. Mary Visheau, who was supposed to be wife No. 1, made a signed statement to the police magistrate today, declaring that she had never lived with Kavanagh, they had never been married. It is charged that Kavanagh was married to Gertha Turner, under the name of Patterson, and the police are trying to make a new charge.

Archie Gibbs, 708 East King-street, has been summoned on the charge of turning in a false alarm of fire. William Faugh, a farmer living near Besseler, has asked the police to locate his wife, who disappeared some time ago.

The committee will spend \$500 on temporary repairs.

Mr. Obermeyer was appointed delegate to the Dominion Trades Congress, which will meet at Quebec on Sept. 17. A committee was named to work with Jos. Marks in establishing a branch of The Industrial Banner.

French Gold for Canada. Now is the Accepted Time to Interest Capitalists.

MONTREAL, Aug. 6.—(Special)—Lemoyne De Martigny, a French Canadian banker, who has for twenty years resided in Paris, where he also represents L. J. Forget & Company, is now in the city and says that the time is very ripe for educational work amongst French capitalists as to the resources of the Dominion.

They are, he says, particularly well disposed towards us, and all they want is the knowledge that the investment is safe. He says it was a great pity that C. P. R. shares had not got into the hands of French investors, when they went to Holland many years ago, for such a transaction would have been a great "ad" for Canada all these years on the French money market.

Speaking of the new government, Mr. De Martigny says that the conservative element, and especially the money people of the republic, are rejoicing over the advent of M. Cocheury to the department of finance. He is brother-in-law of M. Fallain, governor of the Bank of France, and is the right man in the right place.
