London, Sept. 12.—The London Times publishes an article by a neutral who recently travelled in Syria, and who knows the country well.

Government Remains Strictly Neutral. If Quebec is not doing and will not do her share with the rest of Canada in this war, what then? Are we also to hold back because Quebec does not go forward, or are we, not rather to pitch in the harder because no matter what happens we must see to it that we win this war?

It is surely just the same here among ourselves. If some men and some families in Toronto and all over Ontario are holding back and not doing their part in the defence of their country and empire, why should others who measure them for it, still follow their bad example? That is just what it amounts to. They end up just where the others end up, in doing nothing and shirking the call that they plainly hear and inwardly feel. In after life it will avail them little to declare that they would have gone to the war but for the fact that somebody else did not go either, and both hung back together. Those who rank them as two of a kind, and put the question straight to yourself, how else should they be ranked?

It is true that the government of the country has been a slacker itself and has side-stepped the responsibilities of government in the matter of recruiting. It has left to willing soldiers not only the duty of fighting but the whole work of recruiting. The government has put upon those who first volunteer the job of hunting up others whom they can induce to volunteer likewise. The recruiting officers have been thrown on their own resources. They have had no official aid from the nation. They have not even had the influence of the government exerted in their favor to impress public opinion in behalf of what they are trying to do.

The attitude of the government has been one of studied neutrality in the dispute between the soldier over the slacker. They have been left to argue the matter out between themselves.

It is the man in uniform who is himself signed up for overseas. It is his people and not others, who have a right to find fault with the people of Quebec who do not enlist. The individual who shirks his own duty is in no position to censure the occupant of another house, or another city, or another province, for slacking just as he himself is doing.

will mean a saving of twenty-one days in time and of \$24.08 net in expenses. Augustus L. Post said in discussing the plan at the Aero Club of America yesterday. It will make possible two deliveries a month in winter instead of one, and it will shorten the distance to be covered by the mail carriers from 698 to 380 miles.

The scheme of expediting mail delivery by air service in districts where the transportation facilities are limited had been under consideration by the post-office department for some time, Mr. Post said, and it is now ready to attempt a practical experiment to see whether it can actually be carried out. The route for which a trial aeroplane service has been received runs between Seward and Nonge.

By steamer and roads the mail now has to be carried over a route which might roughly be described as two sides of a right-angled triangle. The aviator who will perform the service under the new arrangement will be able to follow the straight line forming the hypotenuse of the triangle. The amount of mail to be carried by each machine will be limited to 1,000 pounds. The severe climate would not be an insuperable obstacle, as aviators are now flying in the winter over snow and ice in Sweden and Russia. Followers of aeronautical affairs are watching developments.

HAVE FAITH IN THE CHILD.

It should not be imagined for one moment that any mechanical system of officials or institution is capable of reforming the delinquent or neglected child. The rigid type of institution with its strict disciplinary methods is apt to create callousness and confirm wrong tendencies, sympathy and comradeship on the part of the social worker is what is needed. Love alone can soften the heart and prepare the way for a changed life. Human character can never be moulded by external forces. It is the awakening of the soul, the planting of some good impulse within, that leads to all lasting improvement, and it is upon this principle that the juvenile court is founded. Unless those who are associated with reformatory effort can impart something of their own personality—convince the child of sincerity and singleness of purpose, inspire with high resolves, and create ambition to overcome faults, then the time spent will all have been in vain. Faith in human nature is essential and there must be a large investment of confidence and trust in the child if there is a real desire to draw out the elemental good. The only education worth while, whether in or out of an institution, is that which permits a fair measure of personal decision, self-control and initiative. And to those who make an honest effort to help a child there is the encouraging thought that, even though they fail to see an immediate response, the good seed planted with earnestness and in hopefulness, will surely take root and blossom forth when the waywardness of adolescent life subsides into more thoughtful channels.
