FRENCH WIN MORE TRENCHES






only as a day in August. The fire, says the despatch, was discovered in the dreadnought's kitchen and spread rapidly. The captain ordered the magazines flooded and tried to beach the battleship, but one magazine exploded before this could be done. The vessel turned over on her side and a large number of the crew was thrown into the sea. It is believed that the battleship can be righted and refloated.

The Leonardo Da Vinci was a slater ship of the Conte DI Cavour and of the Giulio Cescare and was launched in October, 1911. Her displacement was 22,000 tons, and she was 575 1-2 feet long, 91 3-4 feet beam, and carried a total cc iny of 957 men. Her main battery consisted of thirteen 12-inch guns and her second battery, to stand off torpedo attacks, was composed of eighteen 4.7 inch guns. Her engines were of 24,000 horse power designed to develop a speed of 22.5 knots.
