N. B. HIGH Water at Windsor, is when the tide begins to Ebb at Halifax, it begins to flow at Windsor, and at the Full and Change of the Moon, it is High Water at Windsor at Noon, and at the Quarters of the Moon it is High Water at Six o'Clock.
