

APPOINTMENTS TO VOCATIONAL SCHOOL STAFF

Heads of Departments Named Yesterday by Vocational Committee

RETURNED SOLDIERS AMONG THE NUMBER

Instructors Will Supervise Installation of Equipment in the School

At a meeting of the vocational committee of the Saint John Board of School Trustees, held yesterday afternoon, staff appointments for the new vocational school were made. All chosen were New Brunswickers. Some are from Saint John and several served during the great war.

The appointments are to take effect on July 1, at which date the members of the staff will have supervision of the installation of equipment and begin preparing for the opening of the regular courses at the commencement of the fall term of the public schools.

Miss Vera Wilson, of Chatham, was appointed instructor in foods and school. She has been a teacher of home economics in Moncton and Chatham schools and for some time was teacher of home economics in Winnipeg schools. She is at present in the dietitian's department of the Royal Victoria Hospital in Montreal.

ART INSTRUCTOR.

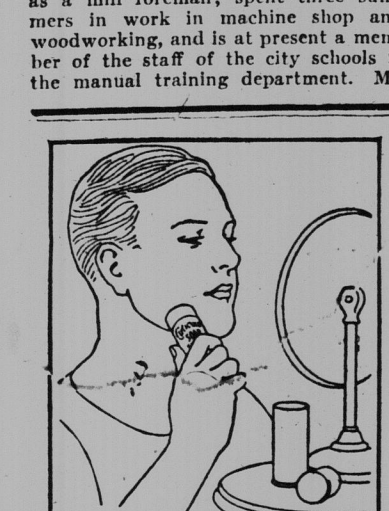

Miss Rheta Inch, of Hampstead, who is now completing her course of study at Columbia University, and was formerly acting director of the home economics department of the provincial vocational school, was appointed as head of the home economics section of the Saint John school some time ago, and is expected to arrive in the city next week.

Bayard Stillwell, of Saint John, who has had much experience in the printing business in the employ of city firms, was appointed as instructor of printing for the new school.

Dr. J. C. Connolly, of Saint John, a graduate of the city high school, and a B.Sc. of St. Francis College, was appointed instructor for practical mathematics. He has taught at St. Francis Xavier College and in Alberta and had five years experience in industry, two years with the Canadian Cement Company and with the Carnegie Steel Company in Boston, and two years with the New Brunswick Electric Power Company. Mr. Connolly was not of age to serve overseas in the Great War.

James D. MacLean, formerly resident of Campbellton, was appointed as instructor of mechanical drafting. He is an M. A. of Mount Allison University, was employed for three years as a mill foreman; spent three summers in work in machine shop and woodworking, and is at present a member of the staff of the city schools in the manual training department. GOOD REPORT ON NURSES' HOME IS RECEIVED

Statistics Presented to G. P. Commissioners by Miss Murdoch

The nurse's home of the General Public Hospital has accomplished one of the objects for which it was built. It has provided healthier quarters for the nursing staff of the hospital. This fact was brought out in the special report received from Miss Margaret Murdoch, superintendent of nurses, at the adjourned meeting of the Board of Commissioners held yesterday afternoon.

The report stated that from Jan. 1, 1912, to April 1, 1916, there was an average of 40 nurses on the staff and the average loss of time through sickness was 21 1/2 days, while from Aug. 1, 1921, to Feb. 1, 1926, the average of nurses on the staff was 60 and the average loss through illness was 13 days. The two periods given in the report showed conditions before the nurses' home was built and after the nurses' home was being used.

M. E. Agar, president, was in the chair. Others present were Commissioners Mrs. J. V. McEllan, Alexander McMillan, J. King Kelly, W. E. Emerson and Mayor W. W. White, and R. H. Gale, superintendent.
