

## WITNESSES TELL OF INCIDENTS IN AUTO RIDE THAT ENDED IN DEATH

Inquest Into the Death of  
Owen McCann  
is Begun.

The inquest into the death of Owen McCann, who died in the General Public Hospital as a result of injuries received in an automobile accident on Saturday night, was begun in the Circuit Court room last evening before Coroner H. A. Porter. Thomas Crawford, driver of the car which struck McCann, was not called, and E. J. Henneberry, who appeared in his interest, announced that he would not put him on the stand. The other members of the party who were in the car at the time of the accident gave evidence similar to that given by them in the police court. The brother of the victim of the accident and several police officers also testified.

W. W. Leonard, the first witness, told of seeing a man crossing Prince Edward street Saturday night. He was struck by a car. The witness followed the man in his own car to Haymarket square, where he picked up Officer Gaudet. They caught up with the other car in the Marsh road.

Dr. Walter Chestnut gave evidence of the condition of McCann and said that he had bruises on the head, elbow and shoulder. Death took place on Tuesday from fracture of the skull. He saw no evidence of liquor about him.

The Woman Witness.

Eva Vidito said she was in the car at the time it struck McCann. She gave the details of the party's trip about town and the vicinity. Besides herself, there were two other women and three men, Crawford, Moore and Garvin.


The men got a bottle of liquor in Fairville. All the men had three drinks, the women did not take any. The other two women got out of the car after they returned to the city. She and the men went into the Boston restaurant and had a lunch. On coming out they drove down Prince Edward street. A man crossed in front of the car and started back. The right fender struck him. She said to Crawford, "Tom, you struck that man." Moore said, "Never mind, you'll be all right."

Crawford later asked Moore to drive the car but he refused. The witness did not see how the men could be sober, as they had been drinking.

William Garvin, owner of the car, told a similar story. Some difficulty was experienced in taking his evidence, as he is deaf.

Edward Moore told of seeing the man in front of the car but thought that he jumped clear. He felt no shock and was sure the horn was sounded. The car was going between eight and ten miles an hour. He told Crawford that he thought the man had not been

struck but that it was a close shave. Crawford was an excitable man. Policeman Gaudet told of the chase of the Garvin car out the Marsh road and the arrest of the driver. When stopped Crawford said: "My God, if I thought I had killed a man I'd go crazy." He saw no evidence of liquor about him.

Detective Saunders said he had questioned Crawford in the detectives' room at the central station. He smelled liquor on him strongly. Crawford appeared agitated and his speech was thick. The witness searched the car and found a bottle partly filled with liquor. He then put a charge against Crawford of operating a car under the influence of liquor. The car had a smear on the right fender as if an object had brushed against it.

Patrick McCann, brother of the victim, said that he had identified the man who died as his brother. Owen's hearing and eyesight were clear. The witness had known him to take a drink.

Officer Coughlan told of picking McCann up after the accident and of his being taken to the hospital. There was no odor of liquor on him, so far as he could detect.

The inquest was adjourned until Monday evening at 7.30. The members of the jury are: E. J. Todd, foreman; Daniel Stockford, J. E. Jones, A. M. Sherwood, William Crabbe, Joseph Taylor and Michael Isaacs.


