NO DANGER OF A WHEAT SHORTAGE

Nor are There Indications of an Undue Surplus This Year.

There is no danger of a world shortage of wheat during the coming year, and there is at present no indication of an undue surplus, according to the October issue of Commerce Monthly, published by the National Bank of Commerce in New York. World wheat production and requirements are approximately in balance.

"Estimated 1921 production of wheat in twenty countries which before the war produced 98 per cent of the known wheat crop of the world, aggregates 2,400,000,000 bushels as compared with 2,384,140,000 bushels produced last year," Commerce Monthly says.

"The 1921 crop of the United States is estimated at 754,000,000 bushels, and of Canada at 294,388,000 bushels. Allowed

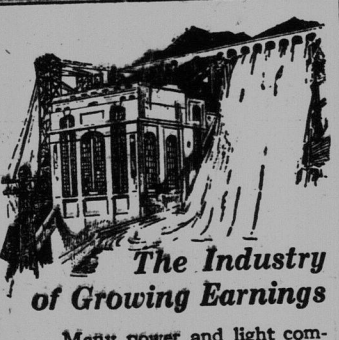
