fruit inspector, announces that there are 150,000 barrels of apples still in the An-150,000 barrels of apples still in the Annapolis Valley. The English market for these is entirely cut off and the western markets cannot be reached to any great extent on account of transportation conditions. Although the fruit growers and dealers are alarmed at the prospect, prices are being maintained at figures that are keeping local sales at the minimum. Six hundred cars are needed to move the fruit from the valley. Food Controller Thompson has been told of the conditions, and asked to take steps to prevent much of this fruit from becoming an absolute waste.

A BIG REDUCTION

Moncton, Feb. 8—Walter Appleton, who has been acting superintendent of Canadian Government Railway stock, has been permanently appointed to the position. G. R. Joughins has retired. W. E. Barnes is appointed general master mechanic in place of Mr. Appleton.

Geneva, Feb. 6-The international comnittee of the Geneva Red Cross unanimittee of the Geneva Red Cross unanimously decided at a meeting held today to address an energetic appeal to the governments of belligerent countries not to employ poisonous gases in warfare.

Annapolis, Md., Feb 4—The Maryland land legislature has practically ratified the federal prohibition constitutional amendment. By a vote of 58 to 42 the house joined the senate this evening in governments of belligerent countries not to employ poisonous gases in warfare. The text of the appeal will shortly be published. 
