MORNING LOCALS

Frederick Reicher and George Fawcett, two young lads, who escaped from the Boys Industrial Home last week, and were captured at Loch Lomond and taken back to the school, ran away from the home again Saturday night, accompanied by Lawrence McCarthy. Scranton, Pa., Feb. 3.—Accepting the advice of their union leaders, the 7,000 miners of eight collieries of the Lackawanna Coal Company, who quit work Saturday morning, resumed work today. Union officials assured the strikers that nearly all the engineers have joined the organization and that the others have agreed to become members. The mine workers refused to work with the engineers who were not members of the union, quitting work Saturday when they claimed that non-engineers were still employed.
