### BEATEN TO DEATH BY FELLOW PATIENT IN ASYLUM FOR INSANE

Gardner, Mass., May 15.—John Miles, a patient in the State Hospital for the Insane at East Gardner, was killed in his cot by Louis Cole, another patient, who beat him to death with a mop handle. Cole was transferred to Gardner a year ago from Northampton Hospital, and during the last few months has manifested violence by assaulting several of the patients. Recently the authorities had asked his transfer to an institution where he could be placed under restraint. Just before noon the attendants left Cole to go down stairs to bring up some dinner to several of the patients. Miles, who was physically unable to leave his bed, was lying in one of the rooms of the hallway.

### When the attendants returned they found Miles dead in bed, his head punctured beyond recognition by Cole. Both patients who figured in the killing came from Montague. Cole is thirty-four and Miles was forty years old or more.
