IN GRIP OF MONEY LENDERS

London, Nov. 19—At a meeting the county council today Viscount Pechairman of the improvements committee, denied allegations recently methat Earl Grey's option on Aldwy site had been transferred to the Fechange of International and Colon Commerce.

London, Eng., Nov. 19—Earl de la Warr's creditors met at the London Bankruptey Court under a receiving Marks creditors met at the London Bankruptcy Court under a receiving order made against his lordship. The accounts showed liabilities at a few pounds under £150,000 and assets £1,000.

O. A. Bennett, for the earl, asked for an adjournment to enable him to put forward a proposal to pay the creditors 7s. 6d. in the pound. His lordship entirely attributed his present position to the losses incurred in his association with a man through whom he had been involved with money lenders. He had proved against that gentleman's estate for £25,000. He estimated his loss in that connection at £70,000.

There was also a large sum of money invested in the Bexhill estates. The money lenders had received from Lord de la Warr more than he had ever received or that they had lent. In 1908 they were partly settled by the payment of 6s. 8d. in the pound.

Mr. Bennett said that if the case went into bankruptcy the estate would not provide sufficient income to meet all the outgoings. He was, he thought, in a position to raise sufficient to pay the creditors 7s. 6d. in the pound.
