

WAR CLOUD IS STILL HOVERING

SERIOUS CONDITIONS IN BALKAN STATES

Servian Assembly Is Considering Crisis—Turkey Bidding Her Time.

Belgrade, Oct. 10.—The extraordinary session of the Skupstina or national assembly, summoned to deal with the existing crisis, was opened this morning amid scenes of great excitement.

Two Austrian flags were burned by a mob in the Atré square this morning. Even in official circles it is now believed that war is unavoidable.

A big mass meeting was held this morning, after which the demonstrators marched to the Skupstina, the members of which are assembling, clamoring for war.

The news that the Austrian monitors, which are coming down the Danube, have reached the Servian frontier, is designed to alarm the people.

Austria is preparing. Paris, Oct. 10.—Official advices received here present the situation between Servia and Austria-Hungary extremely critical.

The 15th Austro-Hungarian army corps occupying the frontier along the Danube and a fleet of river gunboats is concentrating at Semlin.

Further advices received at the foreign office indicate that the excitement among the population of Turkey, who are acting practically under the direction of Sir Edward Grey.

Paris, Oct. 10.—The Vienna correspondent of the Temps says in a despatch that the eleventh and thirteenth Austro-Hungarian army corps with arms and ammunition, are being hurried in the direction of the Servian frontier.

DRUNKENNESS AMONG INDIANS INCREASES

Grand Jury Would Deal Severely With Those Who Supply Liquor.

Kamloops, Oct. 12.—In the presentment made by the grand jury at the assizes here reference was made to the practice of supplying liquor to Indians as follows:

"In view of the very grave crimes, including that of murder, frequently perpetrated by Indians when under the influence of liquor (who are otherwise generally peaceable citizens) and in view of the inadequacy of the statute law to effectively mete out punishment to those who are morally, if not legally, responsible for such crimes.
