Calls Report From Pittsburg That Man Killed Himself for Her False. WASHINGTON, D. C., Sept. 4.—J. B. Patterson, formerly the chorus girl Nan Patterson, today made a statement regarding his daughter's recent disappearance from Pittsburg which represents Dr. Britton, of that city, as having committed suicide because he had been cast off by his daughter. Mr. Patterson said: "My daughter is at home with me and she never saw Dr. Britton and never heard of him. She was in Pittsburg only a short time this summer, and then took an automobile trip with some friends as far as Sandusky. She is very much distressed at this injustice done her, and I am much incensed at the Pittsburg news writers who have made this story out of the whole cloth. My daughter is not separated from her husband. He went to Los Angeles last spring at a time when I was ill, and my daughter remained with me. The understanding is that she is to join him as soon as he gets employment that will justify him in leaving her out there."

McDONALD'S WIDOW INVADERS OLD HOME Emloys Strategy to Gain Entrance to Mansion of Chicago "Gambling King" and Remains. CHICAGO, Ill., Sept. 4.—Mrs. Dora McDonald, widow of "Miles" McDonald, known during his lifetime as "the gambling king of Chicago," has returned to the family residence, No. 4501 Drexel boulevard, where she had not been since last February, when she was admitted to \$50,000 bail to await trial for killing young Webster Guerin, an artist. Her homecoming was unannounced. She arrives last Friday afternoon in a cab, with a train-d nurse and her negro maid from the sanitarium, where she had been since she was released from jail on bond. She is ill and nearly penniless. "I was to be where 'Miles' used to be," was her answer to inquiries, "I have a legal right to be here and here I will stay." The latest action on the part of the widow has startled the other heirs, who fear it may conceal some legal trick affecting their interests. Every precaution possible has been taken to induce her to leave, but without avail, and an armistice has been declared between the contending factions until Wednesday, when McDonald's will is to be probated. J. V. Hinkel, placed in charge of the hours until the will could be probated, was told when she arrived that Mrs. McDonald wished to get some of her things. Once entrenched in the large front room on the second floor, however, she refused to consider such an uncomfortable thing as departing. Last night Mrs. McDonald remained in her room on the second floor, while a close watch was maintained on her by Ricker. A negro maid is the only medium of communication between the two hostile camps. Russell Phillips, grandson of E. D. R. Phillips of Bath, was conveyed to the hospital at St. John on Friday last to undergo an operation for swelling on his knee caused by a nail entering the bottom of his foot some days ago. The wound at the time was not considered very serious. — Woodstock Dispatch.
