

# RATE DOWN TODAY

New York, Jan. 18.—Certain characteristics of today's stock market gave color to the belief that manipulation forces are again active. The market lacked he broad support which accompanied the recent enhancement of values and many of the better known issues were under pressure during the greater part of the day. Extensive profit-taking was responsible in large part for the prevailing irregularity the explanation of which may perhaps be found in the induce prominence which seemed to be accorded to stocks of a class whose pool affiliations have frequently been a subject of criticism in the elight concessions steadled the market and restricted fluctuations for the most part to comparatively narrow limits.

most part to comparatively narrow limits.

Reading was again something of a speculative football, selling off abruptly before it ascended to a new high level, and U. S. Steel was apparently offered freely at every attempt to advance the stock. The charrimans were steady with the Hill issues off fractionally. Rock island common and preferred opened with some show of strength and activity but later sank into comparative obscurity. Pennsylvania and New York Central were at no time especially strong. Norfolk and Western was dull and relatively heavy, presumably on intimations that recent talk of an increase in the dividend rate is at least premature. Canadian pacific and silied stocks were quiet and lower in the absence of such buying as recently characterized the movement in these issues. Apart from American Smelting, which was active and strong on the report that it is to be listed in London, a degree of activity was shown by a number of minor issues.

Prices held firm in the early afternoon with the usual period of duliness but in the final hour another buying movement in the coalers sent Reading and Lehigh Valley up to highest prices with concurrent gains in other standard stocks. In the final trading however, profit-taking brought some recessions and the closing was generally unsettled. London's operations here were estimated at 10,000 shares, sales on balance. Some buying of Southern Pacific for Paris account was reported from London and local bankers with international connections received advices from abroad indicating the imminence of Harriman financing, bresumably for Southern Pacific in Paris, Foreign exchange was weak here, thus aiding in the belief that the English bank is likely to be reduced tomorrow. According to the recognized trade authority a better feeling prevalls in Iron and steel lines because of the buying of pig iron and placing of orders for exports.

The day was a record breaker for many months in the bond market, Sales of Norfolk and Western convertibles, American Teleparaph convertibles, American Tobacco 4's and Rock Island collateral trust issues, were on an enormous scale and comprised the greater part of the day's operations. Total sales, par value, \$5,960,000.
