SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.
 Any person who is the sole head of a family or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must so declare in person before the Dominion Land Agency or Sub-agency for the district, or by a person duly authorized in writing by the applicant, and must make any agreement on certain conditions by father, mother, brother or sister of the homesteader. The homesteader must reside upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may file within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres acre owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister. In certain districts a homesteader is good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section of available land. Price \$3.00 per acre.
 A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a purchase homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.
