AMERICA'S PREMIER JOCKEY IS DEAD

Frankie Robinson the Victim of a Spill in the Sixth Race at Bowie Yesterday—Highest Salaried Ride in States.

Baltimore, Md., April 4.—Frankie Robinson, America's premier jockey, is dead at the University Hospital here, following a fall at the Bowie race track last night.

The accident occurred when a field of eight horses dashed to the first turn in a race of a mile and twenty yards for four-year-olds, and a mix-up followed at the sharp turn.

Robinson, under contract to Harry Payne Whitney, the New York millionaire, and the highest salaried rider in the United States, had a gaping hole torn in his skull at the base.

BANK ROBBERS GET BIG HAUL

Dynamite Safe at Ansted, W. Va., and Escape With \$50,000.

Huntington, W. Va., April 4.—Robbers dynamited the safe of the First National Bank of Ansted, 70 miles east of here, and escaped with \$50,000 in cash and savings stamps early Wednesday, according to a message received by Huntington police asking that a lookout be kept for the bandits who are believed to have come to this city. The robbers, the message said, obtained the loot after blowing the locks of the doors of the vault, but failed to penetrate the inner chambers of the safe in which was \$250,000 in currency.

CREW OF THE RICHARD HAD THRILLING VOYAGE

Providence, R.I., April 4.—The tale of the schooner Louise M. Richard, which left Portland, Dec. 27, 1917, for Halifax and finally reached Porto Rico after 73 days with a few days rest, during that time the crew and the crew forced to drink rain water, was told by Charles E. Nilson, a member of the crew, who returned to his home here today. The schooner was within sight of Halifax when a gale blew her many miles away. For several weeks the vessel made little progress. During this time the crew was obliged to work continuously at the pumps to prevent her from sinking.

WOMEN'S EMANCIPATION BILL IN COMMONS

Given Second Reading and Calls Forth Considerable Discussion.

London, April 4.—The second reading of the women's emancipation bill, which was moved in the House of Commons today by William Adamson, chairman of the labor party and leader of the opposition, Mr. Adamson explained that the object of the bill was to remove certain restrictions and disabilities imposed upon women, entitled them to hold certain civil and judicial appointments and remove the disqualification which prevented women from being voted in the House of Lords. The measure, he said, would give effect to the political and legal equality of men and women.
