station at Sugar Grove. The plant is manned about one-half by scabs who are hauled back and forth from Lancaster, a town seven miles away, where they are housed in a hotel. The strike is being waged for the reinstatement of four engineers discharged by the gas company. The men discharged were officials of the sub-local at Sugar Grove. This is the largest pumping station in the world for boosting the pressure of natural gas. Many cities and towns are supplied with gas through this station.

The company is bringing men from other stations, not organized, to act as strike breakers.
