
Sir:

I have your 309-11 of the 22nd instant, enclosing Mr. Inspector Murison's report on his recent inspection of the various schools in the Onion Lake agency.

Regarding the Inspector's remarks that the 20 H. P. Fairbanks-Morse engine at the Onion Lake R. C. Indian Residential School requires a belt tightener, I have to say the Department is taking this matter up with Mr. Agent Turner, with the request that he have the school authorities arrange to have a belt tightener and pulley, together with a shift lever, provided, in order to make this unit workable. We are also drawing attention to the condition of the plaster which, the Inspector states, has fallen off in many places.

The Agent is also being written with reference to the various suggestions of the Inspector regarding matters that require attention at the Onion Lake C. of E. Indian Residential School.
