NEW BRITISH INDUSTRIES.

\$30,000,000 For Vast Schemes South Wales.

Swansea.—Vast industrial development schemes, entailing an expenditure of \$30,000,000, and introducing new industries to the South Wales district, are being undertaken. The largest is that of the Anglo-Persian Oil Company, who will pump oil from tank steamers into large storage tanks, whence it will travel by pipelines to the refineries at Skeew Baldwins are making rapid strides in the specialized treatment of oil (which used practically to be in German hands), and are about to erect blast furnaces. Borings for coal are being made, and dye works are contemplated.

Plans to develop the mineral and agricultural resources of the Gwyn Peninsula, which stretches ninety miles from Swansea and has vast limestone and coal deposits, are read and the Graigola Patent Fuel Company the largest in the world is doubling its works. Extensions are taking place at other patent fuel works, and steel, tin-plate and spelter works. At Landore new works have been erected to deal with zinc extraction and the promoters' efforts have been crowned with success. This was another process from Germany. The making and the manufacture of higher grades of steel are to be among Swansea's new industries.
