

- [AS AMENDED ON RE-COMMITMENT]

To repeal an Act of the Ninth Year of his late Majesty, for regulating the Carriage of Passengers in Merchant Vessels from the United Kingdom to the British Possessions on the Continent and Islands of North America, and to make further Provision for regulating the same.

[N. B.—The Clauses marked (A.) to (G.) were added by the Committee.]

DERCAS it is expedient to make Provision respecting Preamble: the Carriage of Passengers from the United Kingdom to distunt Countries, and for that purpose to repeal a certain Act passed in the ninth year of the reign of his late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled, "An Act to regulate the Carriage of Passengers in 9 600.4. Merchants' Vessels from the United Kingdom to the Continent and Islands of North America;"

Be it therefore enacted, by The KING's most Excellent MAJESTY. by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, THAT the said recited Act shall be, and Repeal of the same is hereby Repealed: Provided nevertheless, That all Fines. Forseitures and Penalties to which any Person or Persons may have become liable under the said Act, shall and may be sued for, prosecuted and recovered; and that any right of action which may have accrued to any Person or Persons by virtue of the said Act, shall and may be enforced hereafter in such and the same manner in all respects as if this present Act had not been made.

Saving of all incurred by, rights of Action which have accrued
