BAIRD, GEORGE THOMAS. (*Victoria.*)

Of Scotch descent. B. at Andover, N.B., 3 Nov., 1847. M., 12 Nov., 1879, Ida, dau. of Capt. D. W. Sadler, St. John, N.B. Taught a Superior Sch. from 1869 to 1874, and has subsequently been in business as a general trader. Was Postmaster from 1878 to 1882. An unsuccessful candidate at g.e. 1882. First returned to Ho. of Assem. 28 June, 1884, on resignation of sitting mem., Mr. Tibbits, and re-elected at last g.e. A Liberal Conservative.—*Perth Centre.*

BELLAMY, RICHARD. (*York.*)

Ancestors came from France to Eng. at the time of the expulsion of the Huguenots. B. in London, Eng., in 1825, and ed. at the Public Sch. Is a farmer and Land Surveyor. First returned to Ho. of Assem. at last g.e. A Liberal.—*Lower Southampton, N.B.*

BERRYMAN, JOHN, M.D. (*St. John City.*)

S. of John Berryman, a native of Antrim, Irel., who settled in St. John, and married Miss Wade, grand-dau. of a U. E. Loyalist. B. in St. John, 9 Dec., 1828, and ed. at the Grammar Sch. there. M., 16 March, 1864, Mary Annie, dau. of G. S. Brodie of London. Graduated M.D., at Edinburgh Univ., and was for two years assistant to Prof. Sir J. Y. Simpson, of that Univ., after which he served as a surgeon in the American army in the war 1862-3. Has since practised in St. John, and was surgeon of the Garrison Artillery from 18 April, 1864, to Sept. 1875, and of Police from July, 1863 to 1875. First returned to Ho. of Assem. at last g.e. A Liberal.—78 *Charlotte St., St. John, N.B.*

BLACK, JOSEPH LAWRENCE. (*Westmoreland.*)

Grandf., Thos. S. Black, was youngest brother of late Bishop Black of Methodist Church, N.S., who came from Eng. to Amherst, N.S., in 1774. B. in Amherst 1829. Ed.
