S. of Norman Wilfred Kittson, Esq., of St. Paul, Minnesota, U.S., a native of Sorel, P.Q., who was Mayor of St. Paul, and General Manager of Kittson's Line or Red River Transportation Co., by the late Elise Marion, dau. of the late Narcisse Marion, Esq., J.P., a native of St. Jacques de l'Âchigan, P.Q., by the late Marie Bouchard, a native of York Factory, N.W.T. B. 26 Feb. 1853, at North Pembina, (now West Lynne), Man. Ed. at St Boniface College. M. 8 July 1875, to Elise Gingras, dau. of the late Antoine Gingras, a native of Sault Ste. Marie, Ont., an extensive trader of St. Joseph, Dakota Territory, by Scholastique Trottier, a native of St. Francois Xavier, Man. Was employed as Extra Clerk of the Legislative Assembly during the Session of 1879. A member of the Board of Education for the Province of Manitoba. A Vice-President of *L'Association St. Jean Baptiste de Manitoba*. Unsuccessful in contesting the seat for St. Vital at g.e. 1878, and elected at last g.e. for Ste. Agathe.—*Provencher Avenue, St. Boniface.*

LA RIVIÈRE, ALPHONSE ALFRED CLÉMENT. (*St. Boniface.*)

Third s. of the late Abraham C. LaRivière of Montreal, P.Q., by the late Adélaïde Marci, of Longueuil, P.Q. B. in the City of Montreal, P.Q., 24 July 1842. Ed. at Jacques Cartier Normal School, and St. Mary's College, of Montreal, P.Q. M. 4 Feb. 1867, to Marie Melvina Bourd-au, dau. of the late Gédéon Bourdeau, of Laprairie, P.Q. A real estate and insurance agent. Graduated at the Montreal School of Military Instruction, 2nd class, under Col. Lord Alexander Russell, 1865, and 1st class under Col. T. H. Pakenham, 1866; apptd. Ensign in the Reserve Militia, Military District of Hochelaga, P.Q., 1869, and Captain for the Military District of Manitoba, 1871. Apptd. jointly with the Hon. H. G. Joly, President of the Joint Committee of the Board of Agriculture and the Board of Arts and Manufactures, to organize a General Exhibition in Quebec, 1871. Received an appointment in the Dominion Lands Office, Winnipeg, when coming to Manitoba, Oct. 1871, which he held till 1875. Founded the Association St. Jean Baptiste de Manitoba (national) 1872, and elected Presdt.
