Watch how you write it may be too revealing

The study of handwriting is almost as old as writing itself, says Treasure Gibb, a certified graphoanalyst. She says graphoanalysis is a growing science with many practical applications for individuals and for business. When you cross your T and dot your I you may be revealing more of your personality to the trained eye than you may know.

Gibb says your personality traits are coming through, not in content, but in letter formation and style. A graphoanalyst can tell some of your traits at a glance and, given eight hours, can pull together an indepth summation of the traits active in your per-

Graphoanalysis doesn't claim to cure or to foretell. It merely identifies traits you possess.

Treasure Gibb explained some of the introductory

Gibb says the graphoanalyst can be helpful in police work involving forgery. Gibb herself does not do documentary work for police, but has worked for sinesses making final decisions in personnel.

Currently Gibb is corresponding with a teacher in Britain to learn a more intuitive approach to analysis, although she does possess her masters in graphic analysis from the Institute of Graphoanalysis

Courses offering an introduction to the science will be offered this fall at Sheridan College by Richard Webber and through the South Peel Board of Education.
