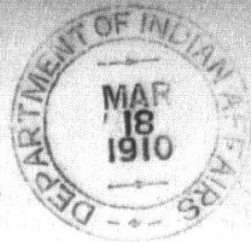

Sir,

In reference to your letter No.331673 of the 7th of December last, I beg to say that from information obtained through Mr. Piton, Q.L. Surveyor, who has recently visited Weymontachingue and Cou-Cou-Cache, it would seem that the Indians located at these two places would be pleased to surrender their reserves, provided they could get other grounds farther north to replace them.

The Honorable Minister of Lands & Forests would be disposed to exchange these two reserves at Weymontachingue and Cou-Cou-Cache for two others of the same area, in the neighbourhood of Kékendatch or even further up the St. Maurice, nearer its source.

The reserve at Cou-Cou-Cache is 380 acres and that at Weymontachingue 7408 acres; total 7788 acres.
