EXTRACT

Medical:

During the month of June the X-Ray Unit visited all reserves and Indian communities in conjunction with the treaty party. All the band members who presented themselves for payment were x-rayed. No sickness of epidemic proportion was encountered during the rounds we made at the various reserves. The Nursing station at Pikangikum, Trout Lake and Lansdowne are fully staffed. Osnaburgh station was closed on account of no available nurse.

Hospital reports indicate that Tuberculosis is definitely on the decline and the number of active cases picked up in the agency during the x-ray at treaty showed a marked decrease.
