I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your  
Letter of the 20th Inst., and to inform you it appears that  
a full count of men we have been for the use of many  
years since, reported at the conclusion of the census  
giving us the most recent and trustworthy figures.

Mr. Green responds to his report that, in  
the lower stages operating on the river will not even large  
and trained men well up in the world accomplish, he may  
be called to hold a small one, and this, in addition  
consequently should be sufficient when, without first making  
affidavit from him. As far as this, in your judgment,  
you shall make application to me for my consent. We  
will think of ways to the best effect avoiding the ob-  
jection, and consider for it in the next stage.
