returning from that point to Port Burwell, and from that harbour steamed along the Labrador coast to the Strait of Belle Isle, and thence to Quebec, where we arrived on October 5, 1909, all well.

Permit me to acknowledge the kindness of yourself, Rear-Admiral Kingsmill, Mr. T. Beland, agent of the department at Quebec, and Captain Edward English of St. Johns, Newfoundland, the last mentioned for engaging part of the crew at St. Johns and handing them their advances. The same attention was shown by officers of the department at Ottawa and Quebec, who assisted in the outfitting of the vessel. I also acknowledge the assistance rendered by Mr. W. W. Stumbles, of the department, who edited and arranged this report.
