lated throughout India. She is a student and a reader, and has put much of her knowledge into Telugu.

Three hundred and fifty-four lepers have confessed Christ and have been baptized, and many more desire it. Miss Hatch passed lightly over her own noble work, for which she believes she has received more than a hundredfold from the Master. Her public service to her country has been recently recognized by King George, who presented her with the medal conferred on those who perform valuable service to their country.

With prayer and praise, in which all joined with Rev. Mr. Wentworth, one of the happiest and most inspiring conventions of our Foreign Mission Society was brought to a close.
