On motion, the Houfe refolved itself into a Committee of the whole Houfe on the confideration of the faid Bill.

The Chairman reported from the Committee that they had gone through the Bill to them referred; and that the Committee had directed him to report the faid-Bill without any amendment; and he afterwards delivered the Bill in at the Clerk's table.

Ordered, That the Bill be engroffed.

Phineas Lovett, Efq. returned duly elected as a Representative for the County of Annapolis, took the usual oaths and his feat.

Then the Houfe adjourned until to-morrow at Twelve of the Clock.

Ordered, That Mr. Lawfon, Mr. Ritchie, and Mr. Crane, be a Committee accordingly.

An engroffed Bill to impofe and appropriate an additional Duty on all Wine hereafter imported into this Province, was read the third time, and thereupon,

Mr. Tonge moved that the Bill do not pass the House, which being seconded and put, and the House dividing thereon, there appeared for the motion four; against it twenty seven.
