On Motion of Mr. M'Neill, seconded by Mr. Dockendorff, the Bill to enable "Creditors more easily to recover their Debts from Co-partners and joint "Debtors," received the fecond reading.

On Motion, of Mr. M'Neill, seconded by Mr. Murray, the "Bill to alter and " amend an Act made and passed in the Twentieth Year of his present Majesty's "Reign, intituled an Act to prevent the cutting of Pine or other. Trees without e permission of the Proprietor, and to prevent the cutting down and destroying " of Fences," received the third reading : and on Motion the faid Bill was passed. Adjourned till 5 o'clock this afternoon.

The House met at 5 o'clock pursuant to adjournment.

On Motion of Dr. M. Aualy, seconded by Mr. M.
