CUSTOMS OFFICIALS.

Business at the Rossland customs office is delayed, and the small staff on duty is overworked in attempting to overtake the extra duty entailed by press of business. The amount of actual business which now passes through this port exceeds that of many other Canadian ports where the staff employed is three or four times as great as it is here.
