A Dominion Conference of Fruit Growers.

According to statistics gleaned from the 1911 Census of Canada, the total value of the fruit growing industry in British Columbia, Ontario, Quebec and the Maritime Provinces is in round numbers \$12,000,000. This is the estimate worked out by the Chief of the Markets Division of the Dairy & Cold Storage Branch of the Department of Agriculture, and published in the printed report of the proceedings of the third conference of fruit growers of Canada held in Ottawa last February.

The funeral of Byron Hennigar, who was killed by lightning in last week's storm took place last Sunday afternoon from the home of his brother, Mr. Sangster Hennigar, of White Rock.
