

HALIFAX, Friday.—The roport of La Have Ferry, by which two little daughters of Henry Renette, aged nine and eleven years, lost their lives while on their way to gather Mayflowers

#### Hanging Is Not Painless,

Says Professor Spitzka, Who Recommends Electro-

cution.

PHILADELPHIA, Friday. accepted idea that execution by hang-ing is a painless operation was disputed by Dr. E. A. Spitzka, the eminent specialist, before the annual meeting of the American Philosophical Society, which began in Independence Hall yesterday. Professor Spitzka said that he had witnessed thirty-one electrocutions at Sing Sing, Auburn in New York and at Trenton, and five hangings at Moyamensing prison in Philadelphia. Electrocution was, he said, the most humane method of inflicting the death penalty, because it was the most efficient, the speediest and the least painful, and he advocated its adoption by the commonwealth of Pennsylvania. In every case of hang-ing, he said, the heart of the viccontinued to beat a long time after the fall through the trap, sometimes as long as thirteen minutes, and he believed consciousness continued or partial consciousness at least from one to one and a half minutes. struggles of the men indicate efforts to find a support for their feet as they swung in the noose. #### POLITICAL NOTES

In 1896 the last year of the Conservative government the total trade of Canada amounted to \$92,154,446, After twelve years of Liberal rule the total amounts to \$638,390,291.

Over 280,000 acres of land have been sold this spring in Manitoba. Of this 100,000 acres are in the Farming home district and will be settled by immigrants from Illinois, Iowa, aud Nebraska. I vouch for the future of the Northwest which means improved trade in the eastern provinces.

The increase of trade during the Tory and Liberal reignes is very striking. For the last cleven years of Conservative rule trade increased by \$50,000,000, and during the eleven years of Liberal rule it has increased by \$350,000,000. It has increased by \$350,000,000. It has increased seven times more under the Liberal government than what it did under Conservative auspices. The figures Conservative auspices. The figures are striking and should lead the electors to think whenever they may be called on to exercise the franchise.
