Fortunately all do not suffer to the

and wrist. If the bite is fresh, an applica-
tion of listerine will sometimes neutral-
ize the poison altogether. Applications
must be made gently, as rubbing will
spread the poison and thus cause a larger
swelling and a more inflamed condition.
A thick cream made of ivory soap and
applied at once will remove the itching,
then as there is no scratching the bite
soon disappears. For some serious bites
that are some hours old and are "angry"
and swollen, make a bath of half a pint
of hot water and one teaspoonful of sal-
ter; bathe gently, as hot as the flesh
can stand. Keep it hot and repeat often;
if on the hands let the child play in the
water and it will soon disappear. Try in
every way possible to prevent their be-
coming stung, and save them the discom-
fort and suffering. Very often extreme-
ly dangerous conditions arise from blood
poisoning by these summer pests.
