### **Employment Service** Of Canada

The Employment Service of the Department of Labour reports that the Dominion and Provincial offices of the Emrloyment Service of Can-ada for week ended July 17 show an increase in placements as compared with the loturns or the preceding week. The offices reported that they had made 7478 references to regular positions and 7122 of these received employment. This represents an increase of 14 when compar ed with the previous week when 7108 placements were reported. In addition 1858 casual jobs were supplied as compared with 1818 during the week ended Ju'y 10.

During the week 8.349 applicants registered, of whom 971 were women and 7,378 were men. This is a decrease of 290 in registration when compared with 8,639 applicants reported during the preceding week. The number of vacancies notified by employers to the Service during the week totalled 9,879 of which 1,047 were for women and 8.832 were for men. This represents an increase of 452 when compared with 9,427 vacancies reported during the week previous. Of the placements in regular employment 701 were of women
