

In ordinary cases the membranes are expelled shortly or in few hours after parturition, while in other cases they are retained for 24 hours or longer and then spontaneously expelled. In other cases spontaneous expulsion does not take place intil after decomposition, when they

are expelled in pus and small pieces The symptoms are usually eviden by the protrusion through the vulve of a portion of the membranes, bu in rare cases this symptom is no present, the membranes being wholly contained within the uterus. In such cases, provided the cow has been untied it is hard to know whether the ire retained or have been eaten by the cow. 
