Between the time his mother left him and the arrival of the trunk the police believe De Brahms prepared a mixture of plaster of paris in which he intended to incase the upper part of the body before he attempted to send it out of the city. He strangled his wife to death, and practically all of the hardened plaster he used was smeared over the neck and shoulders of the dead woman. A strip of cloth was tied tightly around her neck. The trunk was brought to the nouse by Leo. Gilmartin, eighteen years old, of No. 277 Warren Street, Brooklyn. He is employed by the Schwartz Trunk and Leather Com-
