Bulgarian Premier Forces a General European Upheaval.

SOFTA, Bulgaria. Alexander Stamboulisky, since his advent to power as Bulgaria's peasant-premier, has been furnishing Europe with no little amfurnishing Europe with no little amusement by the unceremonious and defiant way he has been treating King Boris, and by his indifferent attitude toward the ever present question of reparations. Not long ago he told the king that if he did not do the bidding of the masses, he might find himself without a throne and in the midst self without a throne and in the midst of a Republic. He added a warning that young Boris must not keep his eye on both sides of the fence; that he could give his support only to one party, and that party the group in power. The stalwart Agrarian leader also has given voice to equally novel expressions on various questions of the day. "My enemies." he says "askthe King to throw me over. But that would not be in conformity with constitutional usage. And then they do not know the King. I have him well trained. We are going to amalgamate the Agrarians, Radicals and Social Democrats for the elections of 1924, unless I am assassinated in the

REPARATIONS ARE HUMBUG. "I like the Bulgarian Communists," Stamboulisky declares, "because they support me without any engagement on my part, which is conveinent for The Communists are practical people, and they will shortly become a party fit to govern. They are forgetting their principles more and more, and they know how to accomodate themselves to circumstances. They know how to talk so as to please people." The Premier says he does not care a snap about reparations. Reparations are humbug. My connections abroad are much stronger and nore numerous than were those of King Ferdinand. Ferdinand knew only crowned heads of no importance while I am on intimate terms with the ruling politicians of the whole world. There is no danger. Nobody will ouch Bulgaria. I have got promises. And when we have come to an understanding with Kristo Rakovski, Commissary in the Ukraine. The Soviets vill not abandon us." Mr.boulisky has voiced a warning as to the future. "Even should nothing else happen," he declared, "there will be a general mix-up before long. Russia is persistently preparing a debacle which is inevitable. We shall plunge into this upheaval too, and something is sure to come out of it. Wait and see."

Steel Airplanes Weigh Less Than Wooden Ones.

Great Britain possesses an allsteel airplane, a distinct departure in erial construction. Except for its canvas wings the entire machine is built of steel. Nevertheless, it is 4 plane of the same dimensions. The claim is made that this machine shows a great advance over German airplanes constructed of aluminium alloy which is said to lack the strength of British steel. It is equipped with two Napier 1,000 horsepower engines. Although designed as a fast long dia nce bomber, it is said to be easy to aneuver as a little fighting scout. because of its steel constructon, which permits the grouping of all veights. INVENTED THIS NECESSITY ITS OF EVERYDAY LIFE. AA When you admire yourself in a norror, break a window-pane, or put on your spectacles, do you ever think about the history of that indispens able substance—glass?

It is believed to have been first worked" in Egypt about 1550 B.O. o that it is not exactly a new idea? The simpler process of "blowing" glass did not appear until 100 B.C. Iwo hundred years later we find the Romans using glass extensively, and establishing centres for its manufacture. Glass articles have been found in the old catacombs.

The Growth of Glass.

HISTORY DOES NOT STATE WHO

Nero is said to have given the quivalent of £50,000 for two special glass cups, thus beating even presant-day prices for rare glassware. When the lost city of Pompeil was excavated, windows of glass were found in some of the houses.

From the Romans, the art of glassmaking spread all over Europe, Limoges and Chartres becoming famous glassware centres in France. About the year 1180 glass was introduced into England from France; and later French experts crossed to England and taught their methods. France also seems to have taken the lead in the manufacture of plate and mirro

Damascus, Aleppo, Cairo, and Alexandria became noted centres for en-amelling glassware, and the industry

was established in Venice before the Thirteenth Century. In England, glass monopolies were

on established, Sir R. Mansell holding the monopoly in this country rom 1618-1653

The first bottle factory in Engl dates from about 1557, and the first English plate-glass works from 1674, this being at Lambeth. In the middle of the Eighteenth Century out glass was introduced, and the art spread throughout Europe. The great glass centres at that time were London, Stourbridge, and Whittington in Eng-

land, and Waterford in Ireland. It was not until the Nineteer Century that lighthouse and optical glasses were made. Then came the machinery era, which took the place of the old glass handicraft. The Glass-Sellers' Company-one of the old City companies-still remains to remind us of the days when glass making machinery was unknown, and

To-day the great centre of glass manufacture in Britain is St. Helen's, ancashire, whence glass finds' its way to most British, and many foreign, homes. It is something no hom can be without.
