Abandoned Ship's Crew.

HALIFAX, N.S., April 27.—(Canadian Press.)—The schooner Patricia M. Beman, formerly the Halifax county schooner Edith Helen Verge, 89 tons, which was found abandoned on Sunday off the United States coast with bullet marks telling a story of

piracy, mutiny, or fake, carried six men when she sailed from Halifax November 16. They were Captain Geo. Thor, whose home address was not given; R. Nelson, 34, mate, of Sweden; Lans Gallander, 36, cook, France; and seamen J. Johnson, 28, Norway; A. Barkman, 39, Rigs; and John Hodder, 21, Newfoundland.

Five Years to Make a Cigar.

It takes from three to five years to make a cigar. That is to say, every cigar represents an investment of labor of three, four or five years, and, in the aggregate, millions of capital tied up for that time. The actual making of a cigar in the factory is really but a minor process in the long line of operations. What counts most is the careful, expert preparation and

the skilful blending of the tobacco. No sooner has the leaf passed into the hands of the agents of the manufacturer than there begins a series of most important steps, calling for a wide range of technical skill in the perfecting of the raw material, that treatment of the tobacco in storage which gives to it the flavor, the mellowness and the sweetness which comes with age.

"From three to five years' imprisonment in the warehouse," is the sentence imposed upon each and every

crop of tobacco leaf that goes into the manufacture of cigars or cigarettes. That is to say, there are from three to five crops as many years old continuously being mellowed by age in the warehouses.
