**Prohibition Fever** 

MERICAN SCIENTIST'S FIGHT TO BAN TEA AND COFFEE,

An effort to prohibit tea and coffee s well as liquor in America is being made, according to the following Reuter message from Trenton, New Jersey.

Mr. Hudson Maxim, a scientist and inventor, of Lake Honatcong, announced recently that he intended to take action under the eighteenth amendment against restaurants, hotels and other places selling tea and

coffee. He now states he has engaged counsel, and intends to proceed with the matter.

A prominent hotel in Newark or New York City, Mr. Maxim asserted, would be selected for the first raid. The eighteenth amendment, declares Mr. Maxim, prohibits intoxicating liquors, and, therefore, applies to all drugs and other preparations which produce intoxication in any degree.

Dictionary definitions, he says, will be sufficient to bring tea and coffee within the Prohibition law.

Irish Boundary Line

CAUSES RATLWAY EMBARRASS-MENTS.

DUBLIN, Mar. 7 (A.P.)-The recent eeting of the Great Northern Railway revealed some conspicuous emparrassments caused by the partition of Ireland, which the chairman said is now two countries. Sixty per cent. of the railway is in Northern Ireland and forty per cent, in the Free State. The line crosses the border 14 times, and at each of these points there is a customs barrier delaying travellers.
